Since opening its doors in 1986, the Center for Wildlife has been the only public facility in the area dedicated to the rehabilitation of sick, injured, and orphaned wild animals.

Over 1,600 animals are brought to the Center each year. The Center's goal in treating these animals is to rehabilitate them fully and return them to their natural habitats, giving them a second chance at life in the wild.

Unfortunately, this is not always possible. There are times when an animal's injuries, even with our best efforts and veterinary treatment, are too severe for it to be released. It simply would not survive in the wild.

In some of these cases, the animal remains at the Center to become an ambassador of its species in our education and outreach programs. Our Ambassadors are brought into classrooms, youth group meetings, civic organizations, elder homes— wherever they are needed. Our visits help people appreciate wildlife by experiencing first-hand their beauty and grandeur.

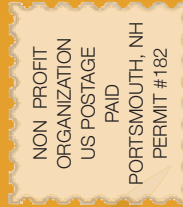


Seeing the animals up close helps us all gain a better sense of how valuable every creature is to our ecosystem, and to our world.
